2005 Water Festivals

Support existing water festivals for children and the general public

Activity Title: Children's Water Festival

Activity Description: Miami Conservancy District supported the 2005 Children's Water Festival by being a member of the planning committee with the responsibility of recruiting and coordinating presenters, giving one presentation, providing a volunteer and a monetary donation.

Start Date: 5/11/2005 **End Date:** 5/11/2005

Result Statement: Miami Conservancy District presented to approximately 100 children on using your senses to determine surface water quality. MCD also supported the festival financially with a cash donation of \$1000 and a staff leadership role valued at approximately \$1600. This person recruited and coordinated over 40 volunteers and educational programs.

Activity Title: Butler County Water Festival

Activity Description: Miami Conservancy District supported the Butler County WaterFest with a monetary donation and provided eight 30-minute presentations.

Start Date: 10/15/2005 **End Date:** 10/15/2005

Result Statement: Miami Conservancy District presented to approximately 200 children. The presentation topics included the diversity of values and opinions surrounding water use, groundwater and the permeability of soils. MCD also supported the festival financially with a cash donation of \$1000.

Activity Title: Preble County Earth Day Event

Activity Description: Miami Conservancy District staff gave eight 25-minute presentations at the Preble County Earth Day event.

Start Date: 4/21/2005 **End Date:** 4/21/2005

Result Statement: Miami Conservancy District presented to approximately 160 sixth-graders on groundwater and the permeability of various soils.

Activity Title: Honey Creek Watershed Festival

Activity Description: Miami Conservancy District supported the Honey Creek Watershed Festival with a monetary donation and participated with a display.

Start Date: 4/23/2005 **End Date:** 4/23/2005

Result Statement: The Honey Creek Watershed Festival was held on April 23, 2005. The event included student presentations, educational displays and other activities. Miami Conservancy District supported the festival with a \$500 cash donation. It is estimated that 600 people were in attendance at the festival. Activity Title: River Days

Activity Description: The Great Miami River Days was held on September 10, 2005. The event was a regional celebration that encouraged visitors to gain a better appreciation for the Great Miami River and its resources, to help protect the beauty of the river and its corridor, to encourage recreational opportunities and to recognize the Great Miami River as an important natural amenity.

Start Date: 9/10/2005 **End Date:** 9/10/2005

Result Statement: Miami Conservancy District supported River Days with a monetary cash donation of \$500 and served on the planning committee. Featured that day was a 2000 gallon river fish tank, dozens of interactive displays, a fishing derby and educational entertainers.
